You'll have the picture round to look at all night, we'll collect that one at the end!















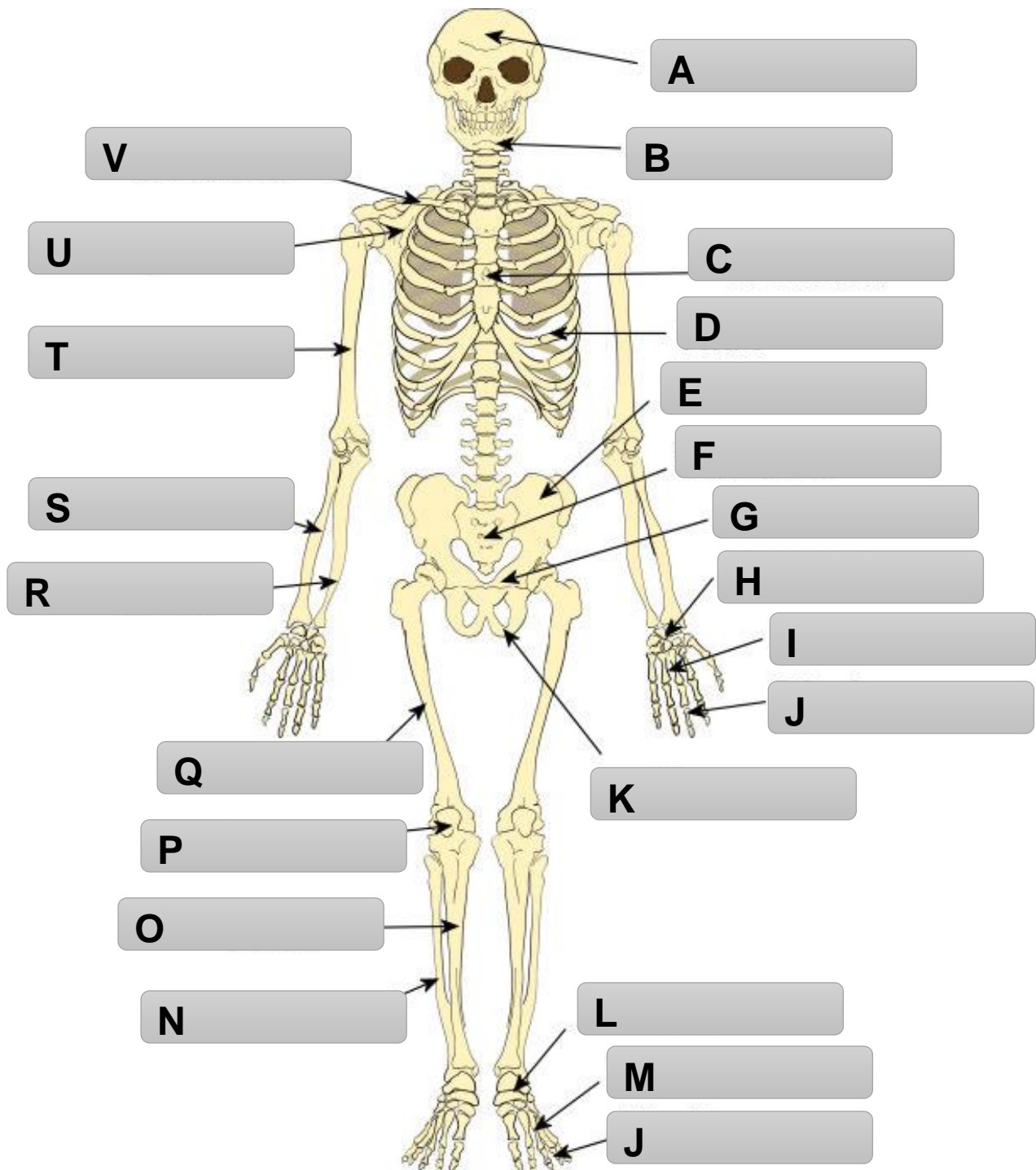
